LIBERTY & DEMOCRACY: MEANS OR ENDS?

For conservatives and neoconservatives democracy is at best a means for safeguarding "individual freedom", i.e. economic liberty, i.e. free enterprise, i.e. the free market. (See Hayek 1944.) For political liberals and socialists it is rather the other way round: political liberty is a means for attaining or preserving democracy, as well as an aspect of democracy itself. Consequently whereas conservatives are ready to sacrifice democracy at the altar of "individual freedom", democrats are willing to curtail some liberties if their exercise threatens democracy. -
