It is usually believed that the biological theory of the mind renders
(E.g. Thorp 1980.)
free will impossible./ This opinion rests on the myth that every scientific
theory is deterministic in the narrow sense, so that it writes off chance
and self-movement. Actually the biological theory of the mind, by showing
the spontaneous neuronal processes, is the best support of the doctrine
of free will.
