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Dear Dr Lewontin

As you may remember, we had a brief exchange of views concerning the desirability and feasibility of convening a conference on materialism and science, and agreed to exchange whatever data or suggestions we might come up with.

I am afraid I have only a couple of ideas--which suggests that I am not a good candidate for organizing the conference. Here they are:

- 1. As you pointed out, we may encounter difficulties in obtaining funds. I am sure the Canadian funding agency (the Canada Council) would not sponsor a conference on "Materialism and science". But on the other hand it might support one on "Science, materialism, and idealism" (particularly if we were to hit on a better title). As for the USA, I don't know what the situation is, but you have there a large number of candidates, such as the National Humanities Foundation, the Matchette Foundation (devoted to supporting research in philosophy), and the Guggenheim Foundation.


