

HOMEGROWN MORAL PHILOSOPHY

Some of the most influential works in moral philosophy, such as Marcus Aurelius's Meditations, Cervantes's Don Quijote, Marx and Engels's Communist Manifesto, ^{and Sartre's} ~~and~~ Dostoievsky's Crime and Punishment, were penned by politicians or artists, not philosophers. Only Aristotle, Augustine (and his Protestant followers), Hobbes, Hume, and Kant, have had a comparable impact--but then almost ^{exclusively} ~~only~~ among intellectuals.
