FREE WILL INDEPENDENT OF CHANCE

Some physicists have argued that quantum indeterminacy is the physical basis of free will. Obviously they did not understand what 'free will' means. Involuntary actions of certain kinds may be regarded as random, but voluntary (conscious, ~~and~~ deliberate) actions, whether undertaken freely or under compulsion, are anything but random. Of course I may choose to let ~~the~~ chance (the flipping of a coin or of a die) select one alternative (e.g. continue with this subject); but this ^{choice} will be an act of free will, so free, indeed, that I commit myself to accept whatever "decision" is taken by chance.
